For the 9th century Mercian queen, see **Beorhtwulf of Mercia**.

Saint Sæthryth (Old English: *Sæþrȳð*; *fl.* 660s), also called **Sedrido**, **Sethrida** or **Saethrid**, was the step-daughter of king Anna of East Anglia, who became a Benedictine nun at the abbey of Faremoutiers-en-Brie, Gaul under its foundress Saint Burgundofara, whom she succeeded as abbess.^[1] Saints Seaxburh, Ethelburga, Etheldreda and Withburga were half-sisters.^[2]

1 Feast Day

Her feast day is January 7, formerly January 10.^{[1][3]}
